

CONTRIBUTORS

DOUGLAS J. WILLIAMSON is a member of the East Ohio Conference of the United Methodist Church. He holds the B.A. degree from Rockford College, the M.T.S. from Harvard Divinity School and the M.Div. from Methodist Theological School in Ohio. He is presently enrolled in the doctoral program at Boston University, where he is working on a Ph.D. in American Church History. Mr. Williamson's paper which is published here won first prize in the John Harrison Ness Seminary Award in 1981.

JAMES H. HITCHMAN is professor of history at Western Washington University, Bellingham. He is a graduate of Willamette University and earned the M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of California, Berkeley.
