CONTRIBUTORS

WALTER J. HOLLENWEGER was born in Antwerp, Belgium. He was reared and educated in Zurich, Switzerland and studied theology at the Universities of Zurich and Basle. Dr. Hollenweger was Research Assistant at the University of Zurich (D.Th., Zurich, 1966); Executive Secretary with the World Council of Churches (1965-71), and since 1971 has been Professor of Mission at the University of Birmingham, England. His article first appeared in *Epworth Review*, Volume 6, No. 2 (May 1979), and is reprinted here with permission.

LEWIS V. BALDWIN, Assistant Professor of Religion at The College of Wooster, Ohio, received the Ph.D. degree from Northwestern University in 1980. Dr. Baldwin has previously provided material for *Methodist History*.
