CONTRIBUTORS

ANNE STREATY WIMBERLY is Associate Professor of Christian Education at the Interdenominational Theological Center, Atlanta, GA. She began her teaching career as a missionary for the Methodist Home Board of Missions at Harwood Girls School, Albuquerque, NM. She is author of *Soul Stories: African American Christian Education* (Abingdon Press, 1994).

MINERVA N. GARZA is an active United Methodist layperson. She is the author of *Historia de La Sociedad Femenil de Servicio Cristiano, Rio Grande Conference, 1933-1970*.
