## CONTRIBUTORS

STEVEN D. COOLEY is Assistant Professor of Religion and History at Urbana University, Urbana, Ohio. He is the author of a number of articles on Methodist spirituality including, "Applying the Vagueness of Language: Poetic Strategies and Campmeeting Piety in the Mid-Nineteenth Century," which appeared in *Church History* (December 1994).

ERVING E. BEAUREGARD is Professor of History Emeritus at the University of Dayton. He is a graduate of the University of Chicago, the University of Massachusetts, and Union Institute. He has also taught at Carnegie-Mellon University. Dr. Beauregard served a term as President of the Ohio Academy of History and is the author of several articles, book reviews, and books including a *History of Academic Freedom in Ohio*.

BRAND W. EATON is Associate Pastor of the Newport (Pennsylvania) Larger Parish. He is completing his M.Div. degree at Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, DC. He has served appointments in the Central Pennsylvania Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church since 1991.
