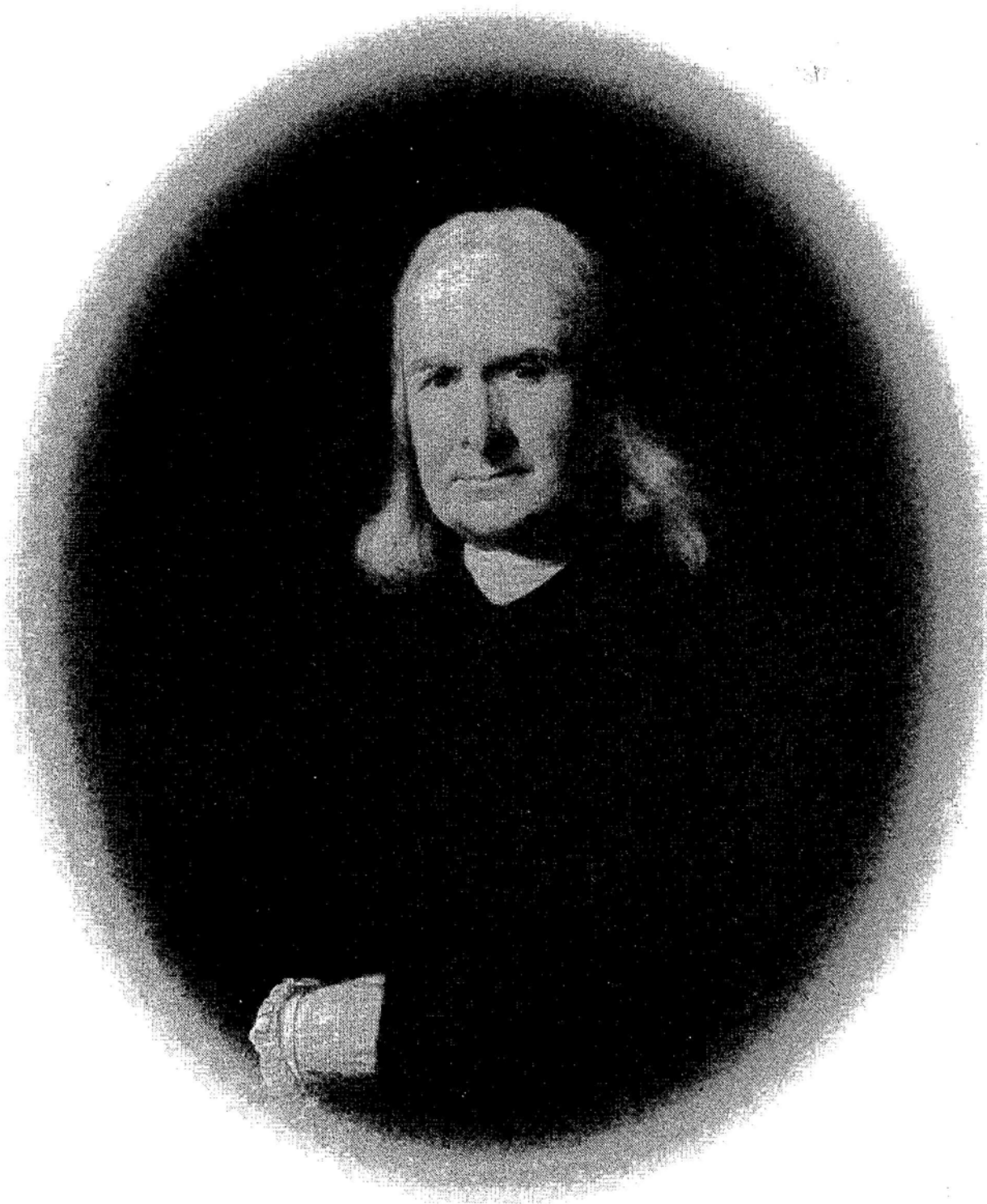

GARETH LLOYD is a Methodist Church Archivist, John Rylands University Library, Manchester, England.
