## CONTRIBUTORS

DAVID H. BRADLEY is Secretary of the A. M. E. Zion Historical Society, with offices in Bedford, Pennsylvania. Dr. Bradley completed and had published last year the second of a two-volume *History of the A.M.E. Zion Church*. He is a noted Methodist historian and contributes to a number of historical journals. Dr. Bradley presented the paper published here at the meeting of the International Methodist Historical Society (now World Methodist Historical Society) in Denver, Colorado, August 17, 1971.

D. A. REILY, United Methodist missionary, has been stationed in Brazil since 1948. He is Professor of Church History at the Methodist Seminary in Sao Paulo, and before 1969 was General Executive Secretary for Missions and Evangelism. Mr. Reily is presently engaged in writing his dissertation on William Capers, leading to the Ph.D. at Emory University.

RICHARD K. MACMASTER is an assistant professor of history at Western Carolina University. He received the Ph.D. in American history from Georgetown University in 1968. He has completed a book on George Mason of Gunston Hall and is currently working on a biography of Henry Highland Garnet.

*Flight City*, a variant of *Delany's*, called in Sullivan County, Tennessee. *Flight City* historically shared with the Carolina towns a weekly and rest day on Thursdays.
