I give thank to God for your faithfulness the good people of Northern Nigeria Annual Conference. I know God is blessing our work and I am so hopeful our future is going to be rewarding if we continue to work as a servant leaders in the name of Christ Jesus. Let us continue to be faithful and be good stewards of what God has invested in our positions. As God's stewards, we would be required to give account of our stewardship. (Jesus story in Mathew, 25:12-30 of the master travelling given task to his servant, demonstrate this fact). As we draw closer to the end of this quadrennial, let's consider the famous commandment of reaching the world with the gospel of Christ. Luke's gospel chapter 10, Jesus commissioned the then 70 to go ahead of him into Jerusalem giving the message of hope. As commissioned by our Lord Jesus Christ in Acts of Apostles Chapter 1: "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the Earth" I commissioned you to **THEREFORE GO!!**

It may not be an understatement to say, we have many places to go than where we have gone. The missions of our church in our book of discipline strategically and perfectly commissioned us to be agent of making disciples and transforming the World. We may have road blocks, but we must go and tell the truth, there may be some obstacle as we go, but we must go, the word of the master must be preached. Our Lord Jesus Christ knowingly confirmed the difficult task ahead of us, but he promised to support us on the mission. We must go to proclaim and nurture the world, leading the world towards gallery of hopes.

We must go or accept to be sent to heed the healing concern of our communities. Evangelization versus social change has been Wesley's concern during his ministerial era. This we must follow. This is exactly the task we are called to do. To do that, we must increase in love. Tom White Wolf Fasset ( a onetime delegate to general conference) in his sermon to very little Church in America said "we must discover again the vocation of being full time Christians". The vocation is to go, obedience to the voice of the master. When we go with the Lord he will go with us. Again, Bishop Gregory V. Palmer in his Episcopal address to the General conference in Portland Oregon 2016 taught us how to pray thus:

Almighty God to you all heart are open, all decision know and from you the secrets are hidden. Clean the thoughts of our heart. Merciful God we confessed that we have not loved you with our whole heart. We have failed to be an obedient Church. We have not done your will, we have broken your Law and we have rebelled against your love. We have not loved our neighbors and we have not heard the cry of the needy, forgive us we pray. Free us for Joyful obedience, through Jesus Christ our Lord...Amen.

### **Human sexuality:**

We have continued to affirm the scriptural and disciplinary position on human sexuality that is Gods good gift to all persons. We call on every one to be responsible stewardship of this sacred gift. Although, all persons are sexual beings whether or not they are married, sexual relations are affirmed only with the covenant of monogamous, heterosexual marriage. And this is the stance of the Northern Nigeria Annual Conference.

We deprecate all forms of commercialization, abuse, and exploitation of sex. We call for strict state and global enforcement of Laws prohibiting the sexual exploitation of children and for adequate protection, guidance and counseling for abuse of children. All persons regardless of age, gender, marital status, or sexual orientation are entitled to have human and civil rights ensured and to be protected against violence. As a church, we support family in providing age appropriate education regarding sexuality to children, youths and adults. Join me all on our state legislators to pass a bill or legislate appropriate measures to be melted on those who are found with habits of rape of any forms.

We affirm that all persons are individuals of sacred world, created in the image of God. All persons need the ministry of the church in their struggles for human fulfillments as well as the spiritual and emotional care of a fellowship that enables reconciling relationship with God, with others and with self. We as members of the United Methodist Church, do not condone the practice of homosexuality and consider this practice incompatible with Christian teaching.

We affirm that Gods grace is sufficient for all. We will seek to leave together in Christian community, welcoming, forgiving and loving one another as Christ has loved and accepted us. I implore you all to pray for families who are self-avow lesbians and gay members. Let us love them as Christ loved us even when we are sinners. We commit ourselves to be in ministry for and with these persons. We shall continue to pray for them especially those whose theologies differ with ours on the matter of human sexuality.

### **Bishop's Episcopal commission finds a way forward:**

You may remember during the 2015 Episcopal message, I called on you to call on for our Church to go to Portland, Oregon for 2016 General Conference, the conference has come and gone, it has left us with good and bad memories. We are left “on the brink” as some will call it.

All our delegates and three alternates were able to attend and all were safely returned back to Nigeria. I'm excited to tell you that you did the right choice of our delegations, they participated positively in the Legislative and plenary session of the conference; one of us was elected Alternate of the Judicial Council. The position that we have never held before.

However, the burning issue of the conference was on “**HUMAN SEXUALITY**”. As earlier mentioned, this became important because the Bishops, at the May 2016 General conference held in Portland Oregon proposed the creation of the special commission, after three days of heated debate, it was approved by the conference's that a commission be set up to look into the issue of a special call session of the General Conference to be convened early 2018. The commission is charged with perhaps the most challenging task given to a body since the formation of the united Methodist Church in 1968, its mandate includes “a complete examination and possible revision of every paragraph in our Book of Discipline regarding human sexuality” and finding some ways to maintain Church unity despite deep differences regarding the Church's sexual Ethics, its teachings on marriage, and increasingly over it polity. I am been named as one of the eight Bishops on the commission. Friends, this is a daunting task, we need your prayers.

### **The financial commitment of the united methodist church (2017-2020):**

The church for this quadrennium (2017-2020) has budgeted \$604 Million approved by the 2016 General Conference. When United Methodist Congregation gave their share of apportioned funds, they participate in God's work. The world service funds is the heart of the collective Church ministry. Through this fund, individuals partner with Church agencies to be in mission and ministry at home and around the world. World service ministry truly makes difference across the globe. World service is God's people reaching out in Love and compassion in the name of Christ. It represents a call and a challenge to each United Methodist. As the 2012 Book of Discipline states; the full payment of the world service fund is each congregation's “first benevolent responsibility”. (812). I therefore urge us to pay our apportionment as sent to us by the General council of Finance and administration accordingly.

### **The state of the nation**

We are aware of the economic quandary in our country in the recent times. We appreciate the effort of the Federal Government under the leadership of President Muhammadu Buhari (GCFR) for the security effort he has made in this region. The recent released of some Chibok girls under the control of Boko Haram insurgents for two years in an indication of a guarantee security. We applaud this giant achievement and continue to impulse the government to intensify its negotiating

machineries to secure the remaining girls. It is our continuous prayers that one day, we will wake up to hear that the other girls with Boko Haram are freed and the region free from insurgency so we can freely reach the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We also want to call on the Local, State and Federal Government to please check the activities of herdsmen/farmers and kidnappers; the activities of these men under world had caused pains and had threaten instability in our homes, families and unrest in the country. We pray that Government will do all at its reach top stop further un-wanton killings and destructions of public property.

As I made it clear during my 2015 Episcopal message that, despite the economic, political and security conditions, we still fin hope in the promise of God's own faithfulness to the creation and humankind and in the liberation hat comes from God's promise. God, who made the creation and saw it good, has ot abandoned it. Even with the present economic situation we are going through God had not let us off, he will surely rescue us.

### **Our social gospel:**

We will continue to go higher no matter how tough the going. The command is that we must go to serve our communities. This is the clarion call despite meager resources available at our disposal. You may recall the year under review; we continue to improve on our community service such as rural health services, education and evangelism.

We continue to appreciate our partners for their support. I want to ask you to be patient sooner or later we will continue to see our partners support. They have promised to undertake some projects. Very soon you will see them swing in action. Ron Wilmot Comprehensive secondary Schools, Damigri Gwandum- Pero is operational. You all know we have admitted another cycle of students bringing the numbers to 48 students (To God be the Glory for this Success).

Our church, the United Methodist, as rightly quoted from Rev. Dr. Susan Henry-Crowe that "we are called to not only hear the fears and see the wounds but to take action against the fear and hate" we are all aware of the success of the workshop in Gombe by Board of Church on Society on building capacity and organizing for Justice with Christian and Muslim Women in Nigeria. The workshop brought Women in focus and it was successfully conducted.

Recently, we had another workshop organized by the United Methodist Communication, I hope the participants to this workshop will make use of new ideas learned to affect communication.

We hope to organize more workshops in the future. We will continue to bring hope in midst of spurn.

### **Clarion call:**

I wish to again appeal to our brothers and sisters in the Southern part of our Episcopal Area who disassociated themselves within our fellowship since 2012 that they are still welcome. It has been my plea ever since , that they should entomb their grievances, whatever they are grieved for on your behalf I still welcome them that we will follow the order of our Church, and we will accept them to work

together in the vineyard of our Lord. I will continue to make it clear that my hands are open, and we will remain receptive to whoever comes back. We shall surely cuddled together and act like the father of the prodigal son.

## **RULES AND PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE OF THE 2016**

1. The session will start by 9:00am – 6:00pm each day
2. All delegates , head of programs and conference officials must be seated by 8:45am before arrival of the presiding officer (Bishop)
3. Any person wishing to contribute in a matter should indicate by hand raising; the presiding officer will permit him/her to contribute
4. Anybody who is permitted to contribute in a matter, must stand up and address the Chair, say his /her name and District.
5. If two people raised up their hands at once to contribute on a matter, the presiding officer will choose one among them.
6. Nobody will be permitted to talk on a matter twice, provided there are persons wishing to contribute on the same issue
7. Nobody will stop a person while talking on a matter, except if he /she wishes to;
  - a. Observation
  - b. Make a point of order
  - c. Clarification
8. A person is only allowed to talk not more than three minute on a matter.
9. Chairmen of committees, Board of Director's head of programs that are not delegates are eligible to contribute on a matter, but they don't have a vote
10. At the beginning of the Conference, two assistance secretaries will be nominated.
11. The conference delegates will nominate a resolution committee, communiqué (tellers and Ushers Boys brigades will be appointed to serve)
12. There will be boundary between delegates and observers
13. All delegates will remain on their seats during plenary session.
14. All delegates, head of programs and observers must switched off their handsets or put it in silent during plenary session.
15. MOTION;- A delegate should speak directly to a motion without much speech
16. VOTING:-
  - a. Voting by raising hand or voice vote.
  - b. Count votes:- Those delegates voting in favour of the motion shall arise and remain standing until counted after which those against the motion shall and remain standing until counted. In case of disability that prevent voting the prescribed fashion, the presiding officer shall recognize the intended vote of that delegate by another means.
17. Any delegate wishing to make reference in the book of discipline or any relevant books should quote the chapter and paragraph or page.
18. No loitering and noise making during the plenary session.
19. The plenary session of every Annual Conference be rounded up on Saturday and Sunday be exclusively for worship, posting, transfer and appointment.

The bishop offered the pastoral prayer after the affirmation of Christian faith by the congregation

The general superintendent ushered the congregation with a chorus in hausa

“ in mun taru kamar haka mu gaida juna muna murna bangaskiyarmu ta tabata don mu ya’ya Allah ne” and the congregation responded melodiously.

Zakka Danfullo as the guest speaker from Ecwa and the cabinet members of the NNAC. -- Special prayer was said in respect of the family of late former G.S Rev. Daniel Y. Korot. Bishop recognized the present of the following guests:

Mai Kaltungo represented by his Highness Village head of Burak Mal. Gundak Garba (JP), Rev. Dr. Hon. Timothy council chairman Shongom L.G.A Gombe State Malam Yahaya Haruna (JP) village head of Gwandum, Hon Phr Sammy J. Barka Hon. K. O. Haruna, former permanent secretary Sammy Mailafiya, Hon. Sati Alhassan, Mr. John Baba former lay-leader NNAC, Hon Darius councilor Gwandum ward, and Suzana John, member Gombe radio co-operation media.

### **Establishment / upgrade of Circuit to charges**

The COM Director of NNAC was call upon to bring the names of zones and charges that are to be promoted, these are: Koros and Pokrekku as charges and U.M.C.N Pilame as a zone under the conference, all these charges/ zones were blessed with the word of prayer by G.S central Rev. Eli Yakub.

### **Offering was collected:**

**Sermon:** - Rev. Zakka Danfullo took his reading in the book of Isaiah 60:1-4 with the themes given as: “**Arise, shine for your light has come**” after he brings greetings from his family and his church he prayed. The speaker affirmed the divine awakening of which it has no regret. The bishop said the benediction after the launching and notices was given by the secretary at 12:35PM

### **Afternoon programs**

- The bar of the conference was established by the assistance secretary of the conference where clergy and delegates were recognized district by district
- There was nomination of resolution committee to the following persons:
  1. Jonathan Manu
  2. Faruk Salisu
  3. Miss. Flora Raymond
- The Bishop addressed the conference and explained about the joint conference that was scheduled to hold in Jalingo as to the following reason:
  1. To see the issue of court case that is still lingering between Rev. Micah's group and the Rev. Johnwesley's administration
  2. To conduct ordination of Pastor's coming from the three annual conferences.
  3. To discuss about additional conference in the Nigeria Episcopal area.
- The minutes of the last conference was read and matter arises from the minute as follows:
  - A. The manager of guest house in Jos was asks to pay the sum of ₦ 100,000.00 as benefit to the family of late Joseph Danbature before the first quarter of the year and also other affected persons.
  - B. The bishop appreciated the budget payment of this year, which only two districts that have not completed theirs. They were urged to try and complete their own
  - C. Concerning evangelism offering the conference was urge to maintain the status co of payments and collection to enhance its activities, also Hon Sammy Barka do promise that from January 2016 he will be paying into evangelism account as donation the sum of ₦ 5,000.00.
  - D. There was emphasis on midweek prayers and Friday teaching to be taken with all seriousness

- E. A motion to continue or not continue with joint district conference was put to vote where those in favor to continue are 85, and those against the motion to continue are 38, therefore joint district conference continues.
- F. Concerning the Ron wilmot seminary secondary schools budget for hostel, the district were urge to complete their payments.
- G. A.D.P fish farming and bulls were under rearing and the bishop commended the Director for being effective in his department.
- H. Concerning payment of bags of grains for upkeep of our orphans, many did not comply with that, so all were encouraged to do so and the list of compliance to the payments should be made.
  - There was distribution of conference delegates into respective legislative committees.

### **Evening session of thursday 26<sup>th</sup> november 2015**

- There was presentation of Sihiyona C.R.I to be upgraded to zone, formerly known as Sabon Layi. The bishop ranked them accordingly.
- C.F.A chairman read his report and the acceptance of the report read was moved. There was complaining on current increase of budget allocation, which a delegate asks for explanation on the method use in allocation budget. The Bishop explain some areas where demands come up, He made example with Randa project of TEKAN, issue of land in Masaka, all which attracts additional means of expenditure and TEKAN budget to our church, there is also budget from NLFA to our church and the court case on the trustees of the church; all these leads to the increase of budget allocations.
- There was some miss-understanding about some payments made by Kano charge to the district for the conference which did not reflect in the report of the C.F.A; the, bishop asked them to go back and sort it out and bring the report in the joint conference.
- It was discovered that the car belonging to the office of G.S is generating problems so the conference agree unanimously that the car should be sold and find a new one.
- It was sounded with strong note that all payments or funds generating from zone/charges for G.S should first be send to the book-keeper and all payments should be backed up with showing of tellers.
- Before coming to every annual conference, the C.F.A should bring or collect bank statement.
- Pastor Alpha Jesmiel Moved for the acceptance of the C.F.A report and the whole delegate seconded.

### **Recommendation from CFA committee**

- To pay budget before 5/1/2016, before embarking on any projects.
- To reduce some special Sundays like the Women pledge day, which is done twice and all laity Sunday. The bishop respond on the special Sunday, that

the mother's day should be observed but normal church offering must be observed as well

#### **Recommendation from districts superintendent committee**

- Tithes and offering should be taught to the churches.
- Special Sunday offering be made to help Mrs. Comfort B. Aggah who was sick for long.

#### **Response**

- All charges that were asked at the joint conference in Bauchi concerning helping the sick with offering should try and remit what they have realized. It was passed that on 6/12/2015 offering would be collected for all the sick Women in Bauchi.

#### **Report from rural health programs**

- It was read and the response was as follows:
- The issue of special Sunday for this program was cancelled.
- A motion was moved to raise money in order to employ staffs who are to be paid and was agreed.

#### **Recommendation from ADP committee**

- It was approved that the programs should embark on rearing of bulls, raising seedling for tree plantation and also improve fish farming as well as poultry production which was in practice
- There is a proposal to training some youth on the poultry production as a means of empowering them after which every participant would be given twenty (20) chicks to go back and rear them.

#### **Friday 27/11/2015 morning programs**

- Exhortation was presented by Rev. Ewan B. Ahmed

#### **Recommendation from village well or rural water project**

- There is need of water in Jada
- Letter of appreciation be written to Hon. chairman Peter Peros and councilor Emmanuel for their effort in erecting a water house at the secretariat.

#### **Response**

- The conference agreed with all recommendation presented and asked for the former chairman of Shongom L.G.A, Mr. Sammy Barka, councilor of Filiya and Gwandum to forward our request to the L.G.A Shongom for assistance toward the pure water factory.

### **Recommendation from education committee**

- The following request were made:
  1. Food stuff be provided by two (2) bags each from districts for Ron Wilmot seminary secondary school Damjigri Gwandum
  2. Government should be asked of additional teachers on secondment
  3. To write to the partners to help shoulder the fencing of the school

### **Response:**

- Two bags each was agreed to be forwarded from Districts, one rice and one maize bags
- It was agreed for the school to liaise with the Dispensary Gwandum for medical attention.
- Instead of asking Government for teachers on secondment, youth corps was preferred to be contacted.
- It was one of the issue worth to be presented that is contact our partners to fencing our secondary school.

### **Recommendation from communication/computer\_business committee**

#### Needs

1. Workers in the business centre should be employed
2. Districts and nearby charges should patronized the place well

### **Response**

- The director council on ministries explained the buildup need of three workers into budget of next year 2016
- There were batteries brought by our partners, but it is not fitting to the computers we have hence, it was advised to contact them for the replacement if possible

### **Recommendation from women division committee**

- There is problem with observing women programs in the church, that pastor should give them upper hand.
- It was agreed for women from districts to bring the one tenth 1/10 tithes of their programs to the women at conference level.

### **Recommendation from youth committee**

- There is need for scholarship to be given to youth.
- A project account should be opened for the youth in the bank

### **Recommendation from evangelism committee**

- It was discovered that, there is no prompt payment of salaries to the workers.
- There should be volunteers in the church in order to take up with the payment of salaries.

- Payment of salaries should returned under the strict knowledge of the evangelism director

### **Response**

- Those that are holding evangelism offering or budget should bring it.
- There was motion of taking payment of evangelist to district, where votes were cast, and those against the motion were the majority
- That all Pastors must pay up to date budget of evangelism before the join conference where the director connectional ministries will bring report.
- The account number of Board of Discipleship ministry was given as 0369885867 first bank Kaltungo branch
- That all money should sent through the stated account.

### **Recommendation from guest house committee**

1. They identify must problems with the generator being used and want the conference to react to it.
2. That the conference should liase with our partners for expansion of the place.
3. There is need for digging of borehole for water to be enough in the guest house

### **Response**

- It was agreed and passed that next year new generator would b e bought.
- Renovation was done and let it be improved more.
- Later the issue of liaising with our partners was ruled out, that let we in Nigeria improved the place ourselves.

### **Recommendation from conference planning committee**

- They discovered late submission of reports for typing and making it into journals.
- That there is need for appointment to be given to the office of historians.
- That next time what this committee needed should be brought in brief or resolution from the joint District conferences.

### **Response**

- Next year by first October, reports should be ready and submitted to the planning committee
- Statistics budget proposals and resolution are the brief reports needed
- Web site should be opened for this conference; the communication director should liaise with C.F.A for the motion to be implemented together with the planning committee and that was agreed unanimously.
- There is need for paper presentation in the annual conference of this kind and that was referred to the planning committee

## **THE REPORT OF CONNECTIONAL MINISTRIES DIRECTOR 2016**

The Resident Bishop Rev. Johnwesley Yohanna

Conference delegates, all protocols duly observed and respected.

I greet you all in Christ Jesus name, and welcome you to this Annual conference session Amen.

### **Program, boards and standing committees**

The Annual Conference has the following programs, Boards and standing committees which are formed so that people in the local churches are offered to encounter God's redeeming love for the world and respond by participating in God's action.

### **Rural Health programs / Board**

In the year under review, the Health program have received a lot of Hospital equipments and health kids from our partners in Iowa and North Georgia. The Iowa partner donated 4 patients beds and mattresses, 2 given sets, 1 baby weighting kids and other assorted kids, while the North Georgia team trained our health workers on "Dentech" with additional 14 tools for extraction of damage tooth and as well distributed assorted eye glasses and drugs free to more than 1,000 patients, drugs revolving fund was also provided by UMcors worth's about N700,000. Details will be seen in Board chairman's report.

### **Agricultural Development Program**

This program is doing well in raising fish, chickens and livestock for sale to church members in subsidized rate to supplement food security. The Director is doing his best in raising varieties of fruit trees seedlings in collaboration with the German Mission partners. In the year under review, about 1,000 tree seedlings was planted.

### **Lit ; lit program**

The program also received 10 cattons of lit – lit kids from Iowa partners this year to train more people within the Conference on how to read and write.

### **Rural water program**

In the year under review, the program are trying to complete the work on sachet water factory. More boreholes will be drilled in the next year in six villages and the damage ones will be respired.

**Education Board;**- The Board has recruited another set of students and staff in Ron Wilmot Comprehensive Seminary Secondary School. Detail of progress reports and challenges shall be seen in the Principal and Board chairman's reports for better understanding for the Delegates in session to deliberate appropriately.

### **Board of Evangelism and Discipleship**

This Board is one among many Annual Conference agencies that provide for the functions of maintaining Connectional relationships between the general Board of Evangelism and Discipleship, Annual Conference, Districts and local churches (BOD 2012 Ph. 630, 1101 – 1102). The main responsibilities is to lead and assist a congregations in the Annual Conference to communicate and celebrate the redeeming and reconciling love of God as

revealed in Jesus Christ to person of every age, ethnic background and social conditions to invite persons to commit their lives to Christ and to his church and to enable people to live as Christian disciples in the world. This board is the worst affected in our Annual Conference for lack of support and care for evangelism and disciple making. The offering donations for payment of evangelist allowances is not coming forth from our local churches.

#### **Sprite lodge Guest House Jos;**

I am delighted to informed this session that the management of the Guest house are doing well to revive the standard of the guest house to meets government regulatory body standard. Also the management are able to pay the debt benefit of one of its staff (Late Baba James Danbature). Details of challenges will be seen in the manager's report.

#### **Computer School / Business Center**

Most of the facilities in the center are functional. The major challenges are lack of patronage by our local churches and programs, and also shortage of man power to manage the center. For the center to function effectively, we therefore advertise for job opportunities on either the business section or as teacher in the institute.

#### **Sub-group ministries**

In the year under review, all the sub-groups ministries have observed their evangelism revival through which many souls were revived and many gave their lives to Christ, which added to the membership roll of the Annual Conference. All have given their proposed schedules of planed activities for anticipated year 2017 for inclusion in the Annual Conference year planner.

#### **Field work students experience**

We are glad that our theological seminary (BTS) as usual sent students to this Annual Conference for their practical work experience, and we really enjoy their teachings and preaching during the exercise.

#### **Appreciation**

- I give thanks to God Almighty for privilege and opportunity to serve him in this capacity.
- I appreciate our foreign partners, most especially the team of our partners from North Georgia, Iowa, UMCOR, UMCOM., German Mission Partners for their Enthusiasm to partner with us in the mission of the United Methodist Church.

## RE PORT OF THE CONFERENCE PLANNING COMMITTEE

The committee's activities started this year by reflecting on the last conference session held between 25<sup>th</sup> – 29<sup>th</sup> November 2015 where the conference lasted for only 3 days as against the usual 4 days because of the issue of joint conference session which other activities will be completed at the joint conference session in Jalingo. This made the planning committee to make adjustments in its plans. Though other things that were purchased were left un-used and returned to the office for subsequent use. The executive Governor of Gombe state Alhaji Dr. Ibrahim Hassan Dankwambo, oon Talban Gombe was to attend the opening ceremony last year but His tight schedule could not permit him, and was ably represented by his Deputy His Ex: Mr. Charles Iliya Danruwatan Tangale. The conference planning committee has the following activities in the annual conference session:

- i. **Feeding:** - The feeding done last year was for the Bishop, important dignatories, security men/women, e.t.c. This year, the feeding is taking the same pattern though we propose to provide entertainment for the delegates once daily.
- ii. **Paper presentation:** - A topic was selected “The church and business investment” for paper presentation at the annual conference session, Facilitators were also consulted at Jos. But we fill that time may not be enough for the delegates and facilitators to understand each other fully. We therefore shifted this activity to January 2017 which will take the form of a workshop. The date and registration fee for the workshop will be announced later. But participants are as follows:-
  - a. 2 delegates from the finance committee of a charge
  - b. 1 delegate of a finance committee in the district
  - c. All conference head of programs and sub-group leaders
- iii. **Website of the Northern conference:-** As resolved last year that the communication director, C.F.A and the conference planning committee should come up with the possibility of creating a functional website in the conference. Both have made a market survey of the project and it is there in the proposed budget of 2017 (find attached).
- iv. **Annual conference registration/report writing:-** This year the committee reviewed part of the registration fees that affected women division and districts, which their fees were increased as follows:-
  1. Districts from 10,000.00 to 12,000.00
  2. Women division from 8,000.00 to 12,000.00
  3. Charges remained 8,000.00

- 4. Programs remained 5,000.00
- 5. Zones remained 4,000.00

The payment of these fees this year was slow. The programs are not even complying. The district superintendents and head of programs have tried submitting their reports on time. Though not on the schedule date line but the reports generally were submitted on time and the size of reports were fairly reduced to lessen the volume of our journal.

- v. **Almanac production:** - This year the committee is making effort to produce an almanac for the conference which by God’s grace will be dedicated and sold to the congregation.

**Recommendations/observations:-**

- 1. That during the deliberations and making recommendations in the legislative committees, it should be limited to not less than 2 and not more than 3 recommendations. This is to avoid multiple resolutions.
- 2. That let the conference have an Audit committee which will be Auditing the conference programs, Districts and charges
- 3. That let the conference appoint a monitoring and valuating theme, who will go round the church development from conference to charges and inspect e.g buildings, resolutions made, budget payments e.t.c
- 4. That from the previous records, we do spend over ₦ 200,000.00 on journal production only. This committee is recommending the use of soft copy of reports on projector films to avoid laborious journals production, if the cost of doing so, will be less to the usual method.
