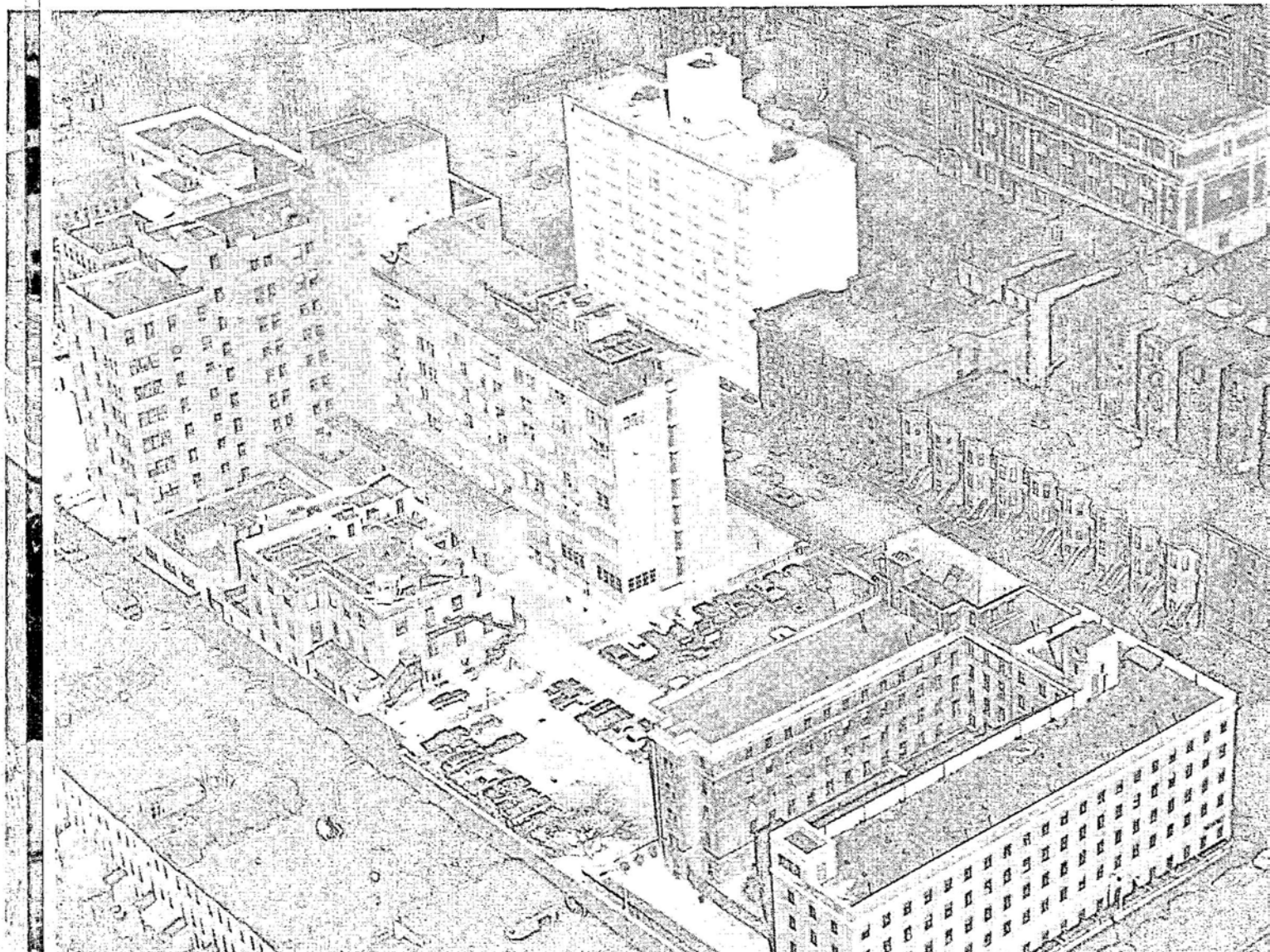

Contributors

W. HARRISON DANIEL, Professor of History at the University of Richmond, received the B.A. degree from Lynchburg College, the B.D. and M.A. degrees from Vanderbilt University, and the Ph.D. from Duke University. Research for this article was done at Wesley House, Cambridge, Cambridge University Library, and the Methodist Archives in London. Dr. Daniel has published more than 35 articles in a variety of journals, including the *Journal of Southern History*, *North Carolina Historical Review*, *The Tennessee Quarterly*, *The Virginia Magazine of History and Biography*, *Civil War History* and the *Journal of Negro History*.

BRIAN R. ROSS, a Presbyterian minister in Sackville, New Brunswick, is a graduate of the University of Saskatchewan (B.A.), Lutheran Theological Seminary (B.D.), and Knox College (M.Th., Th.D.). This paper was presented to the second annual meeting of the Canadian Methodist Historical Society.

FREDERICK E. MASER, M.A., M.Div., D.D., LL.D., is a United Methodist minister, a former Executive Secretary of the World Methodist Historical Society and former pastor of Old St. George's Church, Philadelphia. He has published several books, including *Methodism in Central Pennsylvania, 1771-1969* and *The Dramatic Story of Early American Methodism*, as well as numerous articles in historical journals.

FRANK BAKER, B.D., Ph.D., is a British Methodist minister and is Professor of English Church History in the Divinity School, Duke University. He is editor-in-chief of the Oxford Edition of Wesley's *Works*. Dr. Baker is the author of numerous books and articles relating to the history of Methodism and particularly to John Wesley.

WALTER B. T. DOUGLAS, Ph.D., is Associate Professor of Church History at Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary, Andrews University.
