LACEYE C. WARNER is Assistant Professor of the Practice of Evangelism and Methodist Studies at the Divinity School, Duke University. She is a graduate of Trinity University (A.B.), Duke University (M.Div.), and Trinity College, University of Bristol (Ph.D.). Before teaching at Duke she was E.
