# Contributors

JAMES W. MAY is Professor of Liturgics and American Church History and chairperson of the area of church and ministry studies in Candler School of Theology, Emory University. He received the M.Div. degree from Union Theological Seminary, New York, and the Ph.D. from Columbia University.

DONALD B. MARTI is Associate Professor and chairman of the Department of History in Indiana University at South Bend. He received the B.A. in Political Science from the University of Minnesota, and the Ph.D. in History from the University of Wisconsin.

W. E. KNICKERBOCKER, JR. is Assistant Professor of Church History and Methodist Studies at Memphis Theological Seminary, and is a member of the Memphis Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church. He received the B.A. degree from Washington and Lee University, and the B.D. and Ph.D. degrees from Emory University.
